• New board candidates introduced themselves and briefly talked about their backgrounds and experience before exiting the meeting room for the current board members to vote. Keashia Garner, Lisa Utter and Sam Samano all were appointed to the board via 4-0 votes.

#### **General Manager's report**

- Tom reported that the spring membership drive will run March 14-27, with \$2,750 in matching money already collected.
- The general manager updated the board on the installation of KEXP's former computers at KSER and the music digitization project.
- He noted that three KSER volunteer DJs were nominated for the Best Blues DJ award by the Washington Blues Society.
- KSER and The Village Theater signed a new underwriting contract for \$2,500 to promote their performances on air.
- Tom mentioned early discussions with members of the former Seattle Radio Theater about producing radio plays for KSER.
- The manager also reviewed the station's account balances for the month.

#### **New business**
